## *What Is SOJAC ?...*

The South Jersey Aero Club is a fraternal organization of aviation enthusiasts, both pilots and non-pilots (associates). Pilot members have full voting rights, may schedule the aircraft, and may serve as Club officers. Associates generally are those who have not yet earned their private licenses, those who have decided to suspend flying, or those who just enjoy the camaraderie of an organization dedicated to the fun of flight. Associates are also given “preferred status” if and when they decide to move up to full pilot membership.

Regular meetings are held on the second Wednesday of each month at the Gloucester County Institute of Technology, the Club’s hangar at Cross Keys Airport, and other designated meeting places as required.

Twice each year (spring and fall) all club members participate in a “wash & wax” party at Cross Keys Airport to keep the aircraft looking sharp.

## *Becoming a SOJAC Member*

Pilot-level membership requires: (1) completion of an application form with a one-time initiation fee, (2) successful completion of a check ride with a Club instructor and, (3) approval of the Club’s voting members. Those interested in becoming a member, either pilot or associate, are encouraged to attend Club meetings or use the contact information provided elsewhere in this pamphlet.

## *Aircraft Access*

SOJAC uses both internet and telephone-based aircraft scheduling systems. Members can reserve the plane for both short and long trips.

## *About the Aircraft*

SOJAC’s current aircraft is a four-place 1980 Piper Archer II. The Archer (N2841V) is equipped with a full IFR package including:

- Garmin GTN-750 GPS Transceiver
- GDL-88 ADS-B Transceiver
- GTX 327 Transponder
- PMA 8000B Audio Panel
- Dual attitude indicators (vacuum & electric)
- Autopilot with heading hold
- StormScope
- EDM Engine Analyzer
- 4-place Intercom System

The aircraft is hangared year round.
